

Monroe County 4-H Dress and Appearance Code

You are representing 4-H and Monroe County when participating in 4-H events or events affiliated with 4-H where you are attending as a 4-H member. Therefore, appropriate clothing and appearance must be considered for such activities and events.

Suggestions:

Girls:

Dress slacks or skirts (where appropriate, and skirts must be knee length)
Plain or simple patterned shirts with collar and sleeves (short or long, no sleeveless)
Club and county 4-H t-shirts are acceptable in certain situations
Closed toed footwear when working with equipment, animals, and in the food stand

Boys:

Dress pants (where appropriate)
Plain or simple patterned shirts with collar and sleeves (short or long, no sleeveless)
Club and county 4-H t-shirts are acceptable in certain situations
Closed toed footwear when working with equipment, animals, and in the food stand

Restricted/Required:

For All:

No excessive accessories
No inappropriate logos or designs
No tattoos visible
No large piercings-piercings should be studs for safety
No open toed shoes with animals, equipment, or in the food stand
No jeans with holes
No dirty shirts or jeans in the food stand; you must be presentable and clean-do not come directly from the barn into the food stand

Girls:

No halter tops
No tank tops
No midriffs visible
No short shorts
No revealing pants
No one-shouldered tops
No tube tops
No visible undergarments or spaghetti straps
No excessively tight pants
No poorly placed logos on pants
No visible cleavage
No backless shirts
No high heels

Boys:

No excessively baggy pants
No visible underwear
No tank tops

Violations will be handled by a 4-H Leader. Infractions may lead to judgment by the Executive Board of the Monroe County 4-H Leaders Association.
