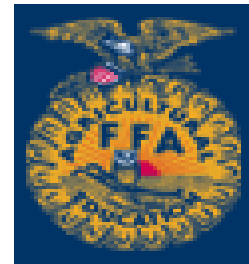

The meeting cycle to qualify is September of calendar year prior to fair and January, April & June of calendar year of fair.
